

Preparing for Internal Audit 'Training Bite'

Not every parish council has to submit their accounts to the External Auditor, but you will all need the services of an Internal Auditor and you might be wondering why.



The answer is because the regulations that parish councils are expected to follow, specify the council must undertake an effective internal audit to evaluate the effectiveness of its risk management, control and governance processes, taking into account public sector internal auditing standards or guidance.

So, you've ticked that box and appointed someone who fits the bill and now you'll be asking what's next!

Gill, who is both an experienced Clerk and internal auditor, will talk about the process involved, the documents you will need to provide as evidence, and the steps the council should take before 31st March, the end of the financial year. Gill is an experienced local council practitioner, having worked as a Clerk for a variety of parish and town councils in the West Midlands since 1992.
